- f. Fixing of wiring for in all the class rooms for running Moodle and newgenlib library software
- g. Organization of training programmes for the use of Moodle & newgenlib software
- (ii) The IQAC resolved that the following necessary works also need to executed with immediate effect:
 - a. Construction of pits for water harvesting
 - b. Construction of vermin compost pits for waste management
- (iii) The IQAC took report of NAAC preparation from the Steering Committee Coordinator Prof. Alok Chansoriya, who informed that the institution has received instructions from the NAAC to submit the SSR before the 26th of July 2015. It was resolved that the same be ensured within the time limits prescribed.

(iv) Plan for Research, Consultancy and Extension Activities

Instructions were given to the Chairman of the Research, Consultancy and Extension Activities Cell to ensure that adequate No. of seminars, workshops and conferences should be held for academic enhancements.

(v) Feedback Report

The feedback report was read by the Principal. The members suggested the Principal to take necessary steps for the further improvement of academic and other activities.

(vi) Publication of College Slate

The Principal presented the College Slate for the session 2015-16 which was accepted and approved by the IQAC.

(vii) Academic Calendar

The Principal presented the academic calendar for the session 2015-16 which was accepted and approved by the members.

(viii) Purchase of books

The Principal informed that books worth Rs. 1,44,888 have been purchased.

- (vi) Purchase of furniture for girls common room
- (vii) White wash of the college building
- (viii) Repair of windows, doors and floor
- (ix) Repair and Maintenance of other items

(x) <u>Baccalaureate Service</u>

The committee expressed its concern over the delay in the holding of the service. It was argued that the delay is incurred due to the delay in the declaration of results by the university examination. Unless the university results are declared the College merit list cannot prepared.

It was finally resolved that the Baccalaureate Service be held as soon as all the results are declared.

(xi) White Gift Distribution Programme

The committee decided that the White Gift Programme should be organized before the Christmas vacation.

(xii) College Magazine

The IQAC expressed its concern over the non publication of college magazine for the year 2013. It instructed that the magazine for the session 2013-2014 and 2014-2015 be published jointly.

Besides, the college has undertaken the following initiatives to make the campus ecofriendly:

(i) Energy conservation:

- Application of energy saving techniques, like, instructing the teaching and non-teaching staff and the students to ensure that the lights and fans are switched off after the last period gets over.
- Air-conditioners of the Principal's and the Manager's room are used economically switched off as soon as they leave the room.
- Lights and electronic systems of the auditorium are put off immediately after the Chapel is over.
- The night watchmen are instructed to put off the outdoor lights with the breaking of dawn.

(ii) Water Harvesting:

07 pits have been constructed for water harvesting at different places in the premises.

(iii) Efforts for Carbon neutrality:

The college has organized a lecture by Professor Rakesh Bajpai, Professor Jawaharlal Nehru Krishi Vishwavidyalaya, Jabalpur on carbon neutrality so

as to make the students aware of the hazards of carbon emissions. In order to sequester the amount of carbon released by an individual the students are promoted to undertake tree plantations.

(iv) Plantation:

Plantation is a regular feature in the college. Tree Plantation programme was organized in the college on 05.06.2016. A number of trees of different kinds were planted in the college campus on this occasion.

In addition to this the college has also initiated the following good practices:

- (i) The college has provided a separate room, well equipped with 10 computers and ICT expert teachers, for the on-line admission of its students.
- (ii) The students of the college have starting using newgenlib software in the library. It's pleasing to watch the students net surfacing in the library.
- (iii) Again it's pleasing to watch the teachers and the students make use of moodle software in teaching, learning and evaluation.
- (iv) The proper functioning of the IQAC has created a very positive impact on the functioning of the college.
- (vi) Add on course of Spoken English has been introduced from the year 2014. A specific lecture of Spoken English has been fixed for all the students after the chapel on every Friday and Saturday.
- (vii) The payment of first installment of Rs.1000/- as seed money to the teachers who are pursuing Ph.D. Course and have been registered as research scholars by the university, have been made to 09 teachers.
- (viii) The college has approved an amount of Rs. 300/- for the teachers to attend seminars/ conferences/ workshops etc. outside the college and to gain thereby the latest information and knowledge available and related to their respective areas of study and research.
- (ix) The college has installed CCTV cameras in all the common areas of the buildings including 07 classrooms in which the university examinations are conducted and also in the college library. The control room is set in the Manager's chamber, which is adjacent to the Principal's room, from where the Manager and the Principal keep a watch over all the activities of the college.
- (x) The IQAC has been restructured to include the names of the external members to the cell in accordance with the instructions as provided by the UGC.
- (xi) Fourteen class-rooms have been equipped with ICT facilities so as to enable the teachers of the various departments to use "moodle" and "newgenlib" software in teaching and learning.
- (xii) Wiring and cabling for the operation of the aforesaid softwares have been fixed in all the class-rooms of the college and whenever the financial resources are made available the college plans to equip all the remaining class-rooms with ICT facilities.
